





The words here, there, above, outside, inside and up add something to the meaning of the verbs sits, stands, sky,played, sat and went. They tell us where the action is done. Such words are also called **Adverbs**.

Words which add something to the meaning of verbs, and tell us how an action is done, where it is done or when it is done, are called Adverbs.
